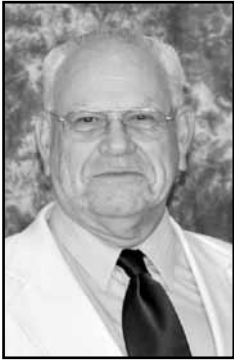

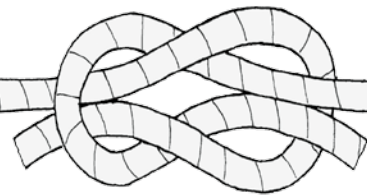

Here is a little history of the Art Ehrmann Cancer Fund:

Art Ehrmann served as the first director of the Eagle's Cancer Fund, founded in November 1959, and as editor of Eagle Publications for 25 years. Art died of cancer and in his memory the Eagle's Cancer Fund was renamed the Art Ehrmann Cancer Fund.

Since the fund began in 1959,

\$50 million has been granted to various institutions for research and related projects. In addition to research, early cancer detection and education are areas that the charitable Eagle dollars have an impact.
