

Until next month --- Keep those 'Cowgirl Booties' on the saddle!!



#### UPDATE ON RHONDA THOMAS

Honorary Past State Auxiliary President Rhonda Thomas is back in Iowa after being brought from Florida on 12/13/11 following a year plus rehab stay.

Rhonda will be residing at Victorian Acres in Altoona, a residential care home for brain injured individuals. Victorian Acres has several houses for their residents and the home Rhonda resides in is called Armstrong House. If any of her friends wish to visit her there they can but, please call first so they know

to have Rhonda prepared to receive guests (this is their policy).

There is no real notable difference in Rhonda from when she left with the exception her daily life is managed better due to caregivers trained for brain injury.

Rhonda's mobility is severely impaired at this time and she spends most of her time in a wheelchair due to falling. She will be starting physical therapy immediately to try and improve her gate. She can do fairly well with

visits on the phone or in person.
