Here we are almost to half way through the year. I would like to thank all the bakers out there for your continued hard work.



Only because of excellent training of medical personal and state of the art equipment are either one of us still here today.

How is this possible? Because of many fine organizations and generous people, none more so than the Fraternal Order of Eagles and the people who belong to the Eagles.

Iowa's very own Lou Reed started this charity while serving as FOE's President. Not only has this fund directly helped many suffering from unplanned, unscheduled, unforeseen disabilities, but we have seen it help in so many ways undreamed of just a short time ago. For example, the state charity a couple of years ago was the EXO SKELETON. This came about due to brilliant research, training and generous funding.

Darwin and I benefited from all of this. Hopefully you will never have to, yet it's good to know research, training and improvements are being made every day in case you or a loved one ever does require help with a spinal injury.

I'm asking you to have a fundraiser for this great charity in your Aerie so we can help all those that suffer.
